

About Today's Offertory

Today's offertory, presented by Rachel, Andrew and Seth Schuck, Katie Sweeney and Chris Starr, concludes the Christmas season by combining two carols based on Medieval and Renaissance era texts. The first is a sixteenth century poem by English Jesuit poet Robert Southwell set by British composer Benjamin Britten in 1942 as part of his *Ceremony of Carols*. The second is Dutch composer Jan Pieterzoon Sweelinck's 1619 setting of the traditional Latin carol *Hodie Christus Natus Est (Today Christ Is Born)*, a paraphrase of Luke 2:11, 13-14 and Psalm 33:1. English texts for both carols are below:

This little babe, so few days old,
Is come to rifle Satan's fold;
All hell doth at his presence quake.
Though he himself for cold do shake,
For in this weak unarmèd wise
The gates of hell he will surprise.

With tears he fights and wins the field; His naked breast stands for a shield; His battering shot are babish cries, His arrows looks of weeping eyes, His martial ensigns cold and need, And feeble flesh his warrior's steed.

His camp is pitchèd in a stall,
His bulwark but a broken wall,
The crib his trench, hay stalks his stakes,
Of shepherds he his muster makes;
And thus, as sure his foe to wound,
