# The Way We Could Be Choosing Words with Care James 3:1-12 (page 1200)

Question: How can we tame our tongue?

#### I. Understand Its Importance (1-2)

<sup>36</sup> But I tell you that everyone will have to give account on the day of judgment for every empty word they have spoken. <sup>37</sup> For by your words you will be acquitted, and by your words you will be condemned." (Mt. 12:36-37)

#### II. Understand its Power (3-6)

<sup>21</sup> As charcoal to embers and as wood to fire, so is a quarrelsome person for kindling strife. (Pr. 26:21)

## III. Understand our Inability (7-8)

<sup>5</sup> "I am the vine; you are the branches. If you remain in me and I in you, you will bear much fruit; apart from me you can do nothing. (Jn. 15:5)

### IV. Understand What it Reveals (9-12)

For the mouth speaks what the heart is full of. <sup>35</sup> A good man brings good things out of the good stored up in him, and an evil man brings evil things out of the evil stored up in him. (Mt. 12:34b-35)

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**Points to Ponder:** In Eph. 4:15 we are called to "speak the truth in love" – what might that mean for the words we speak in this day?
