

Year-End Financial Report

In early December we said we needed \$112,000 to meet our unified budget goal of \$670,000 for the year. We are very happy to announce that based upon preliminary calculations, our total contributions for December amounted to \$121,990, thereby exceeding our December goal by \$9,990. We praise God for this generous response by the congregation in support of our ministries this past year.

We are also excited to announce that the congregation gave an additional \$89,776 to our anticipated 2020 sanctuary improvement capital campaign. This is a great jump-start to a project to significantly enhance our worship facilities, which we will hear more about in the next few months.
