

#### **Heard from the Mission Field**

Liz Loeffler, Greater Europe Mission on loan to Entrust, Women-to-Women Ministry Training (WWMT): Liz recently updated us on her involvement in her first WWMT training hub in the Middle East. Her letter begins, "A Chinese, Egyptian and Turk walk into a room..." No, it isn't the start of a bad joke, but the situation in which Liz found herself as she led an ethically-diverse group of women in a lively discussion around God's Word. It was her first group made up of more nationals than ex-pats (missionaries and others from western countries).

Liz explains in her letter that the method the ladies are taught, called "Dialog Training," helps them develop questions that promote learners to discover for themselves truths from the Bible. They are also given instruction on how to manage group dynamics.

She thanks us for our prayers and support that made it possible for her to take part in this third trip overseas in 2019. She also asks for our prayers regarding her heart issues. A second heart ablation, to correct her AFib, was performed this past Thursday, She asks for prayer that her recovery goes smoothly and that this correction will keep her in normal rhythm for many years to come.

## More Generous Life Spiritual Journey

We are now concluding our booklet entitled A 40 Day Spiritual Journey to a More Generous Life by reading Week 6. It seems that the readings of Days 38-40 are particularly appropriate for members of Great Valley at this time. We pray that this journey has been memorable and a means of spiritual growth — both individually and collectively in our church. May God use our generosity to expand His kingdom and accomplish His purposes!

## **Great Valley and Coronavirus Preparedness**

Has the church heard about the coronavirus? Yes, indeed we have! We are, and have been in discussion about this on several levels; and we will continue to be in discussion in the days ahead. Here are some thoughts we want to share with you concerning this issue:

- 1) Pray instead of Panic.
- 2) Don't miss kingdom opportunities in discussions about the virus. As believers in Jesus we have core beliefs that our world does not share (we believe in a sovereign God, we have a sure and certain hope of an eternity of the very best in life that not even death can steal from us...). As people express fears we may find opportunities to point to how our faith in Jesus makes a difference in our lives even when life seems so very uncertain.
- 3) Be Wise not Foolish. We all know the repeated common-sense measures that health officials are advising; let's be people who follow them (Please note the posters in the church bathrooms).
- **4) Stay Tuned.** To date, the church has taken some measures (signs in bathrooms, increased attention to disinfecting common surfaces, the pastors will strive not to shake hands as people leave worship...). As the situation changes we will institute other changes as needed or advised.
- **5) What can I Do?** Doing the above-mentioned items 1-4 would be a good start. If you would like to take further measures, we would suggest that you volunteer to "adopt" one section of the church and provide one additional level of wiping down common surfaces (we can provide you with an area and a supply of Clorox wipes).
