## Adventures in Kings Go Ask Your Father 2 Kings 3:1-27

Question: Who is worthy of our life's most desperate questions?

Three Kings - Three Answers

Jehoram King of Israel: turned to men in order to register his complaint against the LORD (see vs. 10).

Mesha King of Moab: desperately sought the false god Chemosh by offering human sacrifice - his oldest son (see vs. 27).

Jehoshaphat King of Judah: sought out the Word of the LORD (see vs. 11-12)

## One More King

The King of Kings - Jesus: "If you, then, though you are evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will your Father in heaven give good gifts to those who ask him!" (Matthew 7:11)
